

Thank you to parents and guardians for working with both your children, their teachers, and the SIS administration and doing your best to support the learning during the MCO. And thank you to our teachers for creating safe and stable virtual classrooms, developing responses to a complete shift to online learning in a very short amount of time. Through your efforts, SIS managed to maintain academic pathways and kept our semester viable during the lockdown. For all of our communities, your patience and understanding during these uncertain times were and are truly appreciated.

Normally during my August message, I would be welcoming our new staff to our growing school community. Unfortunately, due to COVID-19 and travel restrictions, I am not able to do so this time. Course Options Selection Night

On September 1 SIS will be hosting our Course Options Selection Night. This event is intended for parents of children in Grades 9 to 11. Our administration and guidance department will present on the course selection process and clarify course choices high school students will have when they begin selecting their courses for the upcoming January – June 2021 semester. This can be a valuable night for parents to better understand the pathways provided in the Ontario curriculum and to better participate in planning the next semester and beyond with their children. It's great to have in-school classes again, isn't it? IBDP classes resumed on July 16 and all the IBDP teachers were impressed with how well our IBDP students learned the content we taught during the Movement Control Order. Our IB teachers worked extra hours to adapt their lessons for online instruction and I know our students had to work harder than normal to learn in these non-traditional ways and their strong understanding of everything taught so far so that effort was fruitful.

IB intends to proceed with the scheduled November exams for Year 2 students, but with new COVID-19 outbreaks occurring worldwide, we have to prepare for the possibility of exams being cancelled. If that happens, coursework will contribute more significantly to the students' final marks, so students should listen carefully to their teachers' advice and strive to submit the highest quality IAs they can.

This year, final grades for IBDP Year 2 students will be released on December 17 and that is the last date I can submit requests to IB for transcripts to be sent to universities for free. Transcripts can be requested after that date, but each request will cost approximately USD17.

IBDP has one intake per year, in January, so students that are currently in either semester 1 or semester 2 of Grade 10 and are interested in taking IBDP courses next year should contact me. Students should apply before November 15 to increase the chances of getting their preferred timetable.

Mobile Library

As part of providing extra services to our students during this pandemic time, the Library Committee has provided a new initiative called The Mobile Library.

The Mobile Library is available at the hall in August during specific time and the daily reading materials changes everyday.




Middle School 100th Day
