UNLOCKING OUR CHILDREN'S POTENTIAL: THE POWER OF CONVERSATION

At Sunway International School, Iskandar, we understand that 'it takes a village to raise a child' and we are passionate about supporting all members of our community to help foster the development of our children to be life-long learners and strong contributors to a positive world. We understand that parents play a crucial role in their child's development and continued success throughout their school lives and beyond. In this article, we will explore one way that parents and teachers can nurture our children's growth. Some may be surprised to learn that one of the most impactful ways of supporting the cognitive development of our children, along with their social emotional health is to engage in frequent, meaningful conversations from an early age, even before a child starts forming words. The research is clear: the more we talk with our children, the more we can positively influence their language and cognitive abilities, setting them up for long-term success.

A landmark study by Hart and Risley (1995) found that children from families with more verbal interaction had significantly larger vocabularies by the age of 3 compared to children from less talkative households; a difference of up to 30 million words. This can have lasting effects, as vocabulary size in the early years is a strong predictor of later academic achievement (Rowe, 2012). More recent research has expanded on these findings, highlighting the importance of the quality of adult-child interactions, not just the quantity. Hirsh-Pasek et al. (2015) observed that children benefit most from "conversational duets" - back-and-forth exchanges where adults respond to a child's cues and interests. These types of responsive interactions help children learn the structure and flow of conversation, which is crucial for developing strong language skills, not to mention social and emotional wellbeing.

The benefits of adult-child communication extend beyond language development. Studies have shown that children who engage in more conversations with adults exhibit better cognitive skills, including improved memory, attention, and problem-solving abilities (Rowe, 2012; Hirsh-Pasek et al., 2015). This is because the act of conversing with a child stimulates their brain, activating neural pathways and promoting the development of executive function skills. As Hirsh-Pasek et al. (2015) explain, "The back-and-forth of conversation requires children to pay attention, remember what was said, and formulate an appropriate response - all of which are key components of executive function."



So, how can we as a community harness the power of early conversation to support our children's development? Here are some research-backed tips:

Talk early and often: Engage your children in conversation from the moment they are born, even if they are not yet responding verbally. Narrate your daily activities, describe what you see, and ask open-ended questions.

Make it interactive: Encourage back-and-forth exchanges by pausing, listening, and responding to your child's cues and vocalizations. This "conversational duet" is crucial for language learning.

Practice Active Listening: Make sure to actively listen to children, giving them your undivided attention and avoiding distractions like mobile phones or TV (Education, 2019).

Find Opportunities in Everyday Activities: Engage children in conversations about their daily activities, such as school or playtime, to encourage them to share their thoughts and experiences. Use these moments to ask questions that spark their curiosity and encourage them to tell stories. (Education, 2019).

Read together: Reading aloud to children and discussing the story, characters, and illustrations can significantly boost their language and cognitive skills (Mol & Bus, 2011).

Use Positive Language and Reinforcement: Using positive and supportive language encourages children to express themselves openly and feel supported in their communication efforts (Alin, 2024).

Limit screen time: Excessive exposure to passive media can hinder the development of important conversational skills. Aim for high-quality, interactive experiences instead.

By prioritizing early, responsive communication with our children, we can unlock their full potential and set them up for a lifetime of success. Let's all embrace the power of conversation and make it a central part of our children's daily routine.

SUMMERTIME LEARNING

With Holidays approaching, parents often wonder how to keep their children engaged in learning during the break. Extended periods away from the classroom can lead to learning regression, but there are effective strategies to mitigate this. As discussed in Ms. Percy's article in this same publication, exposure to a rich vocabulary and frequent conversations are critical indicators of academic success, surpassing the benefits of expensive tuition, worksheets, or advanced educational apps.

Therefore, during this summer holiday, prioritize reading to and with your child and engage in meaningful discussions with your children. For instance, take a walk in the park and discuss the various types of trees, flowers, and animals you encounter. Encourage your child to ask questions and explore their environment. This practice not only sustains their curiosity but also enriches their vocabulary, bridging the word gap and broadening their understanding of the world.

Here are ten additional strategies to ensure your child is exposed to a million words through books, conversation and activities, enhancing their academic success:

Reading Together: Select a variety of books to read with your child. Discuss the storyline, characters, and possible plot developments. Pose open-ended questions that stimulate critical thinking and articulate expression, significantly increasing their word exposure.

Culinary Activities: Involve your child in cooking and baking. Reading recipes, measuring ingredients, and following instructions are excellent ways to practice reading comprehension and mathematical skills while introducing new vocabulary in a practical context.

Science Experiments: Conduct simple science experiments at home. Discuss the scientific principles involved, encourage your child to make predictions, and observe the outcomes together, enhancing their scientific vocabulary and understanding.

Visits to Museums and Libraries: Local museums and libraries often offer educational programs and exhibits tailored for children. Engage in discussions about the exhibits and encourage your child to share their favourite discoveries, broadening their exposure to new words and concepts.

Creative Arts and Crafts: Foster creativity through arts and crafts. Discuss the materials, processes, and final products, which enhances fine motor skills, creative thinking, and introduces new vocabulary.

Board Games and Puzzles: Many board games and puzzles are both entertaining and educational. They can teach strategic thinking, mathematics, and problem-solving skills while introducing new terms and concepts. Discuss strategies and decisions made during the games.

Gardening: Involve your child in gardening activities. Discuss plant biology and the growth process, which teaches responsibility, scientific concepts, and new vocabulary related to nature and biology.

Writing Activities: Encourage your child to write letters to family members or keep a journal. This practice improves writing skills and provides an outlet for expressing thoughts and experiences, increasing their written and spoken vocabulary.

Educational Outings: Plan educational outings to places like zoos, botanical gardens, or historical sites. Engage in discussions about the animals, plants, or historical facts learned during these visits, introducing new vocabulary in an engaging way.

Purposeful Technology Use: While advanced educational apps are not necessary, some screen time with educational content can be beneficial. Choose interactive apps or programs that promote learning and vocabulary growth.

As semester one closes and you approach an extended break from school, remember that the goal is to integrate learning seamlessly into everyday activities, making it both natural and enjoyable. Engaging in meaningful conversations and activities with your child not only helps prevent learning regression but also strengthens your bond and significantly increases their exposure to new words, fostering a lifelong love of learning and academic success.

CHINESE CALLIGRAPHY

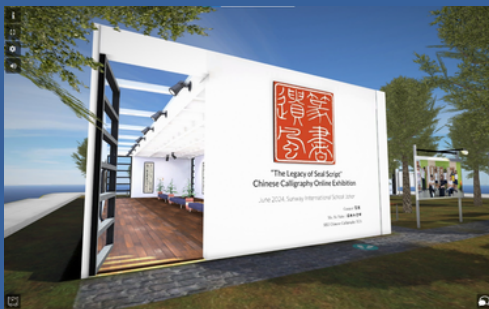

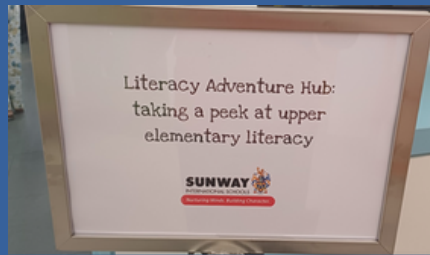


SPRING INTO READING: A FUN-FILLED TWO-WEEK EVENT AT SISJ!
